

University foundations in the digital era How to stimulate participation? The case of the Fondation UQTR

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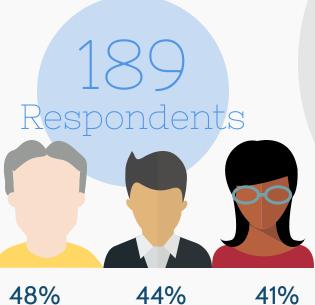

The results presented below stem from a survey that was made among individuals who have made a donation to the Fondation UQTR in the past 10 years, no matter the level of donation. The Fondation UQTR was founded in 1986 and has collected 65 million dollars since its creation.

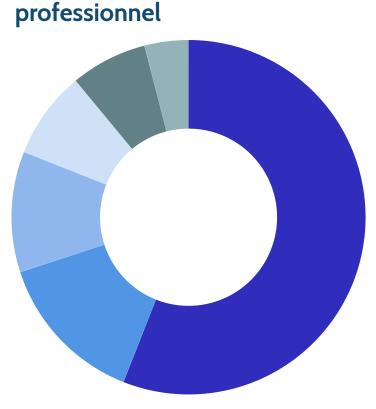

What causes are supported within university foundations?

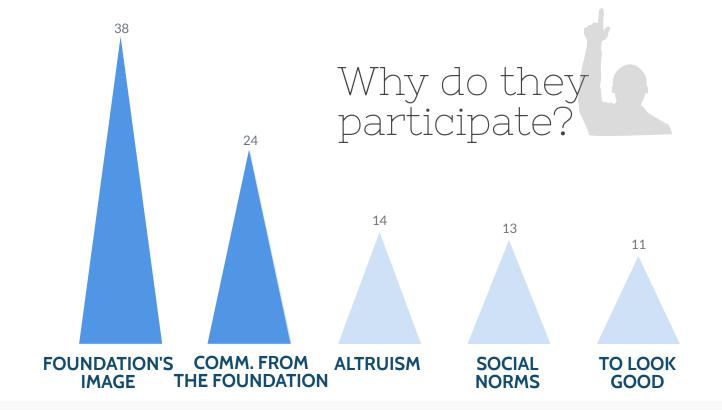
What sociodemographic factors are linked to the intention to donate?
